EU-POP Declaration of Conformity

Declaration on Regulation (EU) 2019/1021
on persistent organic pollutants

Persistent organic pollutants (POPs) are organic substances whose degradation or transformation in the environment is very slow.

Persistent organic pollutants include a number of pesticides (e.g. DDT) and industrial chemicals (e.g. polychlorinated biphenyls, PCBs) as well as the highly toxic dioxins and furans, which are formed as unwanted by-products in production and combustion processes.

For this reason, attempts have been made for many years at the international level to restrict or completely ban the production and use of certain POPs (Stockholm Convention on POPs).

The implementation of the Stockholm Resolutions on the restriction and prohibition of certain POPs was previously carried out in the European Union by Regulation (EC) No. 850/2004, which was replaced by the new Regulation (EU) 2019/1021 of June 20, 2019.

Based on the information available to us from our suppliers and their data sheets, we currently assume that our products do not contain any persistent organic pollutants (POPs, according to Regulation (EU) 2019/1021, Annex I and III).

These statements are based on information from our suppliers and have not been verified by destructive testing methods, or chemical analysis.
